*These majors typically require 79 credits to complete. In addition to the Core Curriculum and major requirements listed, you must complete:*

- **4 elective credits or more** to total at least 120 credits
- A **minimum cumulative GPA** of 2.000 or higher
- The **residency requirement**—45 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)

### ENGL & EDUC/SED Major Requirements – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

**Fall or Spring:**

Select a minimum of **12 credits** (in consultation with your advisor) from:

EDUC 464, Middle School Practicum and Seminar (4-12 cr)

EDUC 465, High School Practicum and Seminar (4-12 cr)

Plus any outstanding major requirements, Core, or electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career

### Additional ENGL & EDUC/SED Major Requirements – Flexible Timing

Select **one course** (3 credits) from the following (typically taken 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year):

- ENGL 255, Publishing and Editing Books (3 cr)
- ENGL 305, Writing for the Professions (3 cr)
- ENGL 306, Reading and Writing Poetry (3 cr)
- ENGL 307, Writing and Reading Fiction (3 cr)
- ENGL 308, Writing and Reading Creative Non-fiction (3 cr)
- ENGL 335, Survey of Composition and Rhetoric (3 cr)

Complete **four courses** (12 credits) in literature, grammar, or writing at the 200- level or above, including at least **one (3 credits)** at the 300- level or above:

- ENGL 209, World Literature (3 cr)
- ENGL 230, Post-Colonial Literature (3 cr)
- ENGL 2\_\_\_/3\_\_\_ (3 cr)
- ENGL 3\_\_\_/4\_\_\_ (3 cr)

Note: If offered under different topics, you MAY repeat any of the following courses, and use them to fill selective credits: ENGL 215, ENGL 241, 242, 251, 252, 261, or 262.

### EDUC Major – Program Standards

Program standards for the EDUC major include, but are not limited to:

- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.750 for all designated licensure courses (see *Educator Preparation Handbook* for more information)
- Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.500
- Receive a passing score on the Communication and Literacy Skills Test (reading and writing) of the Massachusetts Test for Education Licensure (MTEL)
- Receive passing scores on the appropriate MTEL Subject Tests
- Earn minimum grades specified for designated course (see the *Educator Preparation Handbook*)
