GenEd Requirements, Electives, and College Requirements		
In addition to the major requirements listed below, you will need to fill the following General Education (GenEd) categories:		
<ul> <li>WLPL 100, Exploring Movement &amp; Wellness (1 cr)</li> <li>200-level Wellness &amp; Physical (1 cr)</li> <li>300-level Wellness &amp; Physical (1 cr)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Scientific Reasoning (4 cr)</li> <li>Aesthetic Expression (3 cr)</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>This major typically requires 57 credits to complete. In addition to the GenEd and major requirements listed, you must complete:</li> <li>26 elective credits or more (depending on GenEds selected) to total at least 120 credits</li> <li>A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.000 or higher</li> <li>The residency requirement—45 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)</li> </ul>

ECON 320, Economics of Healthcare (3 cr) – should take 3rd or 4th year HSCI 201, Introduction to Health Care Ethics (3 cr – also fills Spiritual/Ethical GenEd) HSCI 460, Health Law (3 cr) Select **two courses** (6 credits) from the following: BUSM 372, Services Business Managing and Marketing (3 cr) BUSM 379, Human Resource Management (3 cr) HCMT 486, Health Care Management Internship (1-6 cr)\* HSCI 130, Introduction to Public Health (3 cr) SOCI 330, Sociology of Health and Health Care (3 cr – also fills the Multicultural component of the International/ Multicultural Studies GenEd) – should take 3rd or 4th year, typically offered only in fall) \*SPCO 220, Internship Preparation Seminar (1cr) is a prerequisite for HCMT 486; it does not count as part of the required 9 cr.
