Core Curriculum Requirements, Electives, and College Requirements

This major typically requires 45 credits to complete. In addition to the Core Curriculum and major requirements listed, you must complete,

- 38 elective credits or more to total at least 120 credits
- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.000 or higher
- The residency requirement—45 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)

Fall:

COSJ Major Requirements - Typical Third-Year Schedule

Fall or Spring:

There are no major requirements specifically recommended for your third year. You should select major requirements, Core, or electives to total 30 credits for the year.

COSJ Major Requirements – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

Fall:

COMM 482, Seminar in Mass Communications (3 cr) Plus Core and major requirements, or electives to total approximately 15 credits

Spring:

Outstanding major requirements, Core, or electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career

In general, 200-level courses can be taken first year or later, 300-level can be taken second year or later, 400-level can be taken third or fourth year. Check course descriptions for specific prerequisites.
