

Springfield College Sequencing Guidelines Physical Education Major (PEDU) ▼ 2021-2022

If you entered Springfield College in 2021-2022, use this guide for sequencing your courses. Requirements are subject to change and may not be offered when listed. Use your online degree audit to verify your progress, and always confirm your plans with your advisor.

Core Curriculum Requirements, Electives, and College Requirements

In addition to the major requirements listed below, you will need to fill the following Core Curriculum categories:

- I 00-level Wellness & Physical (I cr)
 300-level Wellness & Physical (I cr)
 - cr) Literature (3 cr)
 cr) Spiritual and Ethical (3 cr)
- Historical and Social (3 cr)

These majors typically require 92 credits to complete. In addition to the Core Curriculum and major requirements listed, you must complete:

- 9 elective credits or more to total at least 120 credits
- The residency requirement—45 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)

EDUC 328, Sheltered English Immersion (3 cr – concurrent with Pre-practicum; fills Themed Exploration Core) PHED 308, Adapted Physical Education Programming (3 cr; C or better required – fills half of WAC Core) PHED 309, Adapted Physical Education Programming Lab (0 cr)

Select **4 credits** of pre-practicum:

PHED 348, Elementary Physical Education Pre-practicum and Seminar (4 cr)

OR

PHED 350, Secondary Physical Education Pre-practicum and Seminar (4 cr)

Plus major requirements, Core or applicable electives to total 30-33 credits for the year

PEDU Major Requirements – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

Select 12 credits of practicum:

PHED 485, Physical Education (5-12) Practicum and Seminar (12 cr; B or better required), if you completed PHED 348 or

PHED 484, Physical Education (PreK-8) Practicum and Seminar (12 cr; B or better required), if you completed PHED 350 Plus any outstanding major requirements, Core requirements, or electives to total a minimum of 120 credits for your career

Additional PEDU Major Requirements – Flexible Timing

In general, 100-level courses should be taken first or second year, 200-level courses can be taken first year or later, 300-level courses can be taken second year or later, and 400-level courses can be taken third or fourth year.

PEDU Major - Program Standards

Program standards for the MOST/PED major include, but are not limited to:

• Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.750 for all designated licensure courses (see degree audit for more information)

- Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.500
- Receive a passing score on the Communication and Literacy Skills Test (reading and writing) of the Massachusetts Test for Education Licensure (MTEL)
- Receive passing scores on the appropriate MTEL Subject Test
- Earn minimum grades specified for designated courses
- Be recommended for admission to the teacher licensure program by the PEHE department chair
