



## Springfield College Sequencing Guide Art Therapy and Education Major ▼ 2018-2019 Visual Arts Teacher Licensure Program

If you entered Springfield College in 2018-2019, use this guide for sequencing your courses. Requirements are subject to change and may not be offered when listed. Use your online degree audit to verify your progress, and always confirm your plans with your advisor.

### GenEd Requirements, Electives, and College Requirements

In addition to the major requirements listed below, you will need to fill the following General Education (GenEd) categories:

This major typically requires 98 to 102 credits to complete (totaling as many as 126 to 130 credits with additional GenEds). You will not need any electives to total the College requirement of 120. In addition to the GenEd and major requirements listed, you must complete:

- The **residency requirement**—60 credits taken at Springfield College (including 15 of your last 30)

ENGL 113, College Writing I (3 cr – also fills half College Writing GenEd)

ARTS 108, Studio in Drawing (3 cr – also fills Visual/Performing Arts GenEd)

ARTS 111, Studio in Design (3 cr)

ATPY 101, Introduction to Art Therapy (3 cr)

*If recommended:*

ENGL 100, Writing Studio (1 cr)

Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total approximately 15 credits

**Spring:**

ENGL 114, College Writing II (3 cr – also fills half of College Writing GenEd)

ATPY 105, Methods and Materials of Art Therapy (3 cr)

EDUC 237, Foundations of Multicultural Education (3 cr –

also fills the Multicultural component of International/Multicultural Studies GenEd and Social Justice GenEd)

Plus major requirements with flexible timing to total 30-36 credits for the year

**Fall or Spring:**

PSYC 101, Introduction to Psychology (3 cr – also fills Behavioral/Social Sciences GenEd)

*If offered, take:*

ARTS 255, Introduction to Art Education (3 cr)

*If 255 is not offered, take:*

PSYC 109, Human Development (3 cr)

### Major Requirements – Typical Second-Year Schedule

**Fall:**

EDUC 238, Pre-Practicum in Special Education (1-6) (1 cr)

**One of the following courses:**

ATPY 203, Art Therapy with Special Needs Populations (3 cr – ATPY 203 preferred if offered)

EDUC 162, Exceptional Children (3 cr)

Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total 16-18 credits

**Spring:**

ARTS 116, Studio in Painting (3 cr)

ARTS 210, Figure Drawing (3 cr)

PSYC 109, Human Development (3 cr) or ARTS 255,

Introduction to Art Education (3 cr – whichever you did not take 1<sup>st</sup> year)

Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total 33-36 credits for the year

### Major Requirements – Typical Third-Year Schedule

**Fall:**

EDUC 234, Curriculum, Methods, and Organization for Secondary Teachers (3 cr)

Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total 16-18 credits

**Spring:**

ARTS 280, Integrating Arts in the Classroom (3 cr)

Plus major requirements with flexible timing or GenEds to total 33-36 credits for the year

**Fall or Spring:**

ATPY 309, Pre-Practicum in Art Therapy and Art Education (3 cr)

EDUC 328, Sheltered English Immersion (3 cr – take with EDUC 364)

EDUC 364, Pre-Practicum-Teaching and Special Issues in Secondary Education (3 cr)

### Major Requirements – Typical Fourth-Year Schedule

**Fall:**

ATPY 484, Practicum in Art Therapy (3 cr)  
Plus any outstanding major requirements or GenEds

**Spring:**

ARTS 382, Seminar in Teaching Art (1 cr)  
12 to 16 credits of Practicum chosen (in consultation with your EDUC advisor) from:  
EDUC 464, Middle School Practicum and Seminar (4-12 cr)  
EDUC 465, High School Practicum and Seminar (4-12 cr)  
EDUC 468, Elementary (1-6) Practicum and Seminar (4-12 cr)

### Additional Major Requirements – Flexible Timing

ARTS 103, Studio in Computer Graphics (3 cr)  
ARTS 217, Arts of Prehistory to the Renaissance (3 cr – also fills half of the WAC GenEd)  
ARTS 219, American Art 1700-1900 (3 cr – also fills half of the WAC GenEd)  
ARTS 223, Studio in Ceramics (3 cr)  
ARTS 225, Studio in Photography (3 cr)

Select **one** of the following courses:  
ARTS 211, Studio in Sculpture (3 cr)  
ARTS 228, Three-Dimensional Design (3 cr)

ARTS 105, Studio in Printmaking (3 cr)  
ATPY 504, Printmaking for the Art Therapist (3 cr, a graduate-level course which may be taken for undergraduate credit)

ARTS 270, Advanced Studio in Ceramics (3 cr)

### ATPY Major – Program Standards

Program standards for the ATPY major include, but are not limited to:

- Earn a 2.500 GPA or higher in all program requirements
- Earn a cumulative GPA of 2.500 or higher
- Earn a C or better in all courses with an ARTS or ATPY prefix

### EDUC Major – Program Standards

Program standards for the EDUC major include, but are not limited to:

- A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.750 for all designated licensure courses (see *Educator Preparation Handbook* for more information)
- Earn a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.500
- Receive a passing score on the Communication and Literacy Skills Test (reading and writing) of the Massachusetts Test for Education Licensure (MTEL)
- Receive passing scores on the appropriate MTEL Subject Tests
- Earn minimum grades specified for designated course (see the *Educator Preparation Handbook*)
